CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION

Based on the data presentation and analysis in previous chapter, it can be drawn such following conclusion.

Two Emily Dickinson poems have symbol of nature there are: "Nature is what we see" the symbol of nature in this poem are: hill, afternoon, squirrel, eclipse, bee, heaven, bobolink, sea, thunder, cricket and." A bird came down the walk" the symbol of nature in this poem are: bird, angle worm, grass, beetle, feather, ocean, butterflies

The first poet then concludes that nature is inexpressible. Although everyone knows what nature is, words fall short before the task of explaining it. Nature is simple yet, nevertheless, it is a hidden mystery, and human wisdom is incapable of understanding it. Despite the many attempts to define nature through the senses (what we see, what we hear), through abstract notions (what we know), through emotions (nature is harmony), and through metaphysics (nature is heaven), the task still seems impossible

and Dickinson eventually concludes that nature remains inexpressible. "Our Wisdom", capitalized for emphasis, is "impotent" when it comes to understanding nature despite its "Simplicity", also capitalized for emphasis. Despite the simplicity of nature, it remains a mystery containing many secrets and hidden knowledge a matter that renders nature similar to Dickinson's poem 668 "'Nature' is what we see" which contains many secrets and hidden knowledge.

The second poet it seems as if Dickinson has chosen to write about a pretty ordinary event an encounter between the poet and a bird. At first, the bird is observed

unnoticed; however when the narrator offers it a crumb, the bird flies off. Dickinson able to describe the beauty of the ocean with his imagination by looking at the sky

From the point of view above, it can be concluded that the poems of Emily

Dickinson have a different symbols of nature in each poem, and Emily usually use simple words, it can be seem at Emily's poem she used the real name of the things and she used at her poems and the meaning of the words is the things it self. For the example she used a bird for describe a bird it self, very simple word but very deep meaning
