

## CHAPTER V

### CONCLUSION

After analyzing and discussing the data to answer the statement of the problems, this chapter presents the conclusion of the analysis. Firstly, concerning choice of words male and female use some similar taboo words in expressing their emotions. Those words are *f\*\*k*, *s\*\*t*, *H\*\*l*, *d\*\*n*, *a\*\*hole*, *b\*\*ch*, *nigger*, and *d\*\*k*. However, male only spoken taboo words are *Oh, my God (OMG)*, *d\*\*k* and *b\*\*st* and female only are *s\*\*ks*, *c\*nt*, *g\*\*hand* *d\*\*b*. The findings also show the fact that both male and female do not use *Jesus Christ* and *c\*\*ks\*\*ker* in their talk or when they are expressing their feeling. Then, there is a word not used by female but used by male i.e. *Oh, my God (OMG)*.

Next, the preference in using taboo words is more on male than female when they are talking or communicating to express their feeling or emotions. It is found that taboo words exist in male talks as many as thirty-one (31) and female twenty-three (23). It is clear that male tend to use more taboo words than female (Jay, 2009:155). In this case the words *f\*\*k* and *s\*\*t* are mostly used by both male and female i.e. one-third of the occurrences. According to Jay (2009) the use of these taboo words remains stable over the past 20 years.

Finally, the situation in which those taboo words are used is sometimes not the same for both male and female. In this case, female tend to use *f\*\*k* or *f\*\*king* when they are angry. In contrast to this male tend to use those words when they are not angry. So, it can be inferred that the word *f\*\*k* or *f\*\*king* is used in different emotion situation by male and female.

It is also found in this research that female is not the expert of euphemism related to the data taken. They also use taboo words in their talk or communication even the frequency is lower than male. Then, the kinds of taboo words used could be different, for example, Oh, my God (OMG) that is commonly uttered by female but in this finding is used by male.

All in all this research has provided the choice of swearing words, the frequency of their occurrence and the situation in which those words occur. However, there are still a lot more interesting kinds of taboo words to analyze that are not covered by this research. Hopefully, this research can be one of reference for further research about taboo words.
