## **CONCLUSION**

The main objectives of this study are to find out the metaphor presented in the Abraham Lincoln's speech. The data analyses show that there are some metaphors items used in the language of Abraham Lincoln's speech. They are Nominal, Predicative, Sentential, Dead and Live metaphor. The metaphors are used in speech is in order to interest the audiences in listening and easier in memorizing.

Based on the result and discussion that have been presented in chapter IV, it can be drawn that the first the finding concerning with the metaphor used in Abraham Lincoln's speech. There are five metaphors used in these three speeches, and the dominant kind of metaphor is predicative metaphor. The titles of the speeches that the researcher analyzes are Lincoln's Fist Public Speech, from an Address to the People of Sangamon County. March 9, 1832, Lincoln's Farewell Address at Springfield, Illinois. February 11, 1861, and His Proclamation for a Day of Thanksgiving. October 3, 1863. And for the second is the finding concerning with the meaning of Abraham Lincoln's speeches.

Finally, the reasons why the metaphors are used in the speeches are for inviting the audiences think more in face of subject of education in the future, expressing to everyone about the imaginative way of describing something, persuading public discourse, getting easier to remember and understand the

speaker mean, giving information, analyzing political discourse, communicating with audiences in social activity, and watchful of the future in their life.
