CHAPTER III

METHOD OF THE RESEARCH

This chapter discusses The Nature of the Research, The Source of the Data, The Selection of the Data, The Data, and the Steps/ Phases of the Research.

3.1 The Nature of the Research

According to Neville's view, Research method is an important part in conducting a research (2007:1-4). The method used in this paper is descriptive qualitative. He gives reason that a qualitative research is more subjective in nature than Quantitative research and involves examining and reflecting on the less tangible aspects of a research subject, e.g. values, attitudes, perceptions (2007:5). He exemplifies, although this type of research can be easier to start, it can be often difficult to interpret and present the findings; the findings can also be challenged more easily.

Based on short story *Fat and Thin* laden with the conflicts of the main characters, then the writer will examine such works with the theory of character and characterization, conflict and plot. The theory of character and characterization, conflict and plot is used to analyze the main characters in Anton Chekhov's *Fat and Thin* i.e Misha, Nathaniel and Porfiry, the conflicts of the main characters as follows the internal and external conflict, the plot of Anton Chekhov's *Fat and Thin* are as follows: exposition, rising action, climax, falling action, resolution

(Denoument), and the influence of the main character's conflicts toward plot in Anton Chekhov's *Fat and Thin* that are found in the novel.

3.2 The Source of the Data

The method of data collection is done against the object writer research short story *Fat and Thin*, by utilizing a library research, research conducted in work space researcher or at the library where the researcher obtains data and information about the object of his research through books or other audiovisual tools (Semi, 1993:8). The utilization of these libraries is done considering the data used in this study is entirely derived from written sources or library, such as books, journals, encyclopedias, articles, magazines, newspapers and so on.

The study observed short story entitled *Fat and Thin* by Anton Chekhov. This research focused on the character and characterization, the conflict and plot employed in the short story. They are as follows:

- 3.2.1 The Main Characters in Anton Chekhov's *Fat and Thin*:Misha, Nathaniel and Porfiry.
- 3.2.2 The Conflicts of the Main Characters: the internal and external conflict.
 3.2.3 The Plot of Anton Chekhov's *Fat and Thin*: Explosition, Rising Action, Climax, Falling Action, Resolution (Denoument), The influence of the Main Character's Conflicts toward Plot in Anton Chekhov's *Fat and Thin*.

3.3 The Selection of the Data

This section to describe about the character and characterization, the conflict and Plot in the short story entitled *Fat and Thin*. They are analyzed through the following steps:

- 3.3.1 Reading and studying the short story entitled *Fat and Thin* by Anton Chekhov.
- 3.3.2 Reading and identify the character and characterization, the conflict and plot in the short story.
- 3.3.3 Analysis the character and characterization, the conflict and the plot implied in each of the short story. And then, find

the influence of the Main Character's conflicts towards plot in Anton Chekhov's *Fat and Thin*.

3.4 The Data

In general the data is taken from the novel entitled *Fat and Thin* by

Anton Chekhov that writer presented here are from two sources:

3.4.1 The main data

In this case the main data, the writer taken from short story

entitled Fat and Thin By Anton Chekhov.

3.4.2 The additional data

The data used in this study is entirely derived from written sources or library, such as books, journals, encyclopedias, articles, magazines, newspapers and so on.

The next paper entered chapter 4 analysis and findings.
