

## CHAPTER V

### CONCLUSION

This Chapter presents the conclusion from the result of analysis in the previous chapter. This part of research shows the conclusion of the answers to the problems of the study; conflict faced by Dexter are Dexter's internal conflicts and Dexter's external conflict, and American Dreams influence Dexter to resolve his conflict.
