ABSTRACT

This study is sociolinguistic study. It focuses on Swearwords Used by Youth of Mojokerto in Communication. Actually, as main function of language is for communicating with each other. Language phenomena in the social interaction, seemingly, make a language being various and interesting. This thesis presents a number of swearwords commonly used in Mojokerto. Its focus is on different analyzes purposes which can be conveyed using the forms *Cok, Jancok, Mbokne ancuk, Matamu picek, Asu, Jangkrik, Mbokne dobol, Tak asap boto raimu, Bedes, Bajingan, Wergul, Jamput, Jancurit, Koyok wedus, Setan alas, Rai gedeg, Ulo, Goblog, and Cocotmu*. Contrary to the most belief that swearwords are "meaningless", it is shown that each of these swearwords can be used to convey a number of specific meanings. These meanings are sometimes related, but each needs to be defined independently if similarities and differences between terms are to be precisely captured. The use of swearwords in different languages and different cultures is not homogeneous on the contrary, practices can be very varying.

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
