5.1. Conclusion

5.2. Suggestion

If in this study the poem chosed to analyzed is only three of John Keats poem, that are entitled when i have fears, ode to a nightingale, and a thing of beauty, then on the next study that may conducted by the next researcher can take a wider scope, which is analyzed and compared the poems not only from one poet but from two or more poets. So that the result will provide new insight regarding the structure and style of different poem from different poet. The next suggestion is related with the analyze method that can be used by the next researcher, that is not only in two level of stylistic

analysis as in this study but also include overall level of analysis. So that the result will provide more detail on the structure and theme of the poems.
